Detailed Notification for BBPSC – 26

1. CANDIDATES TO ENSURE THEIR ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EXAMINATION:

All candidates are requested to carefully read the Rules of Mini Civil Services Examination Notified by the Blue Birds International School and this Notice of Examination is derived from these Rules:

- The Candidates applying for the examination should ensure that they fulfill all eligibility conditions for admission to examination.
- Their admission to all the stages of the examination will be purely provisional subject to satisfying the prescribed eligibility conditions.
- Mere issue of e-Admit Card to the candidate will not imply that his/her candidature has been finally cleared by the Commission.

2. HOW TO APPLY:

- Candidates are required to apply online by using the website <https://www.bbisdnr.in/> using the tab **BBPSC (new)**.
- It is essential for the applicant to register himself/herself first at Registration platform, available on the School's website, and then proceed for filling up the online application for the examination. If the candidate is already registered, he/she can proceed straightway for filling up the Online Application for the examination.
- Candidate should submit their application form (Hard Copy) along with the specified Exam Fee **(Rs. 100/-)** to their respective class teachers.

The candidates should reach the venue of the Examination well in time at least 30 minutes prior to the commencement of each session of the Examination. No late entry will be allowed inside the Exam-venue under any circumstances.

3. LAST DATE FOR RECEIPT OF APPLICATIONS:

- The Online Applications can be filled from **14th December 2025** up to **23rd December 2025 till 2:00 PM**.
- The eligible candidates shall be issued an e-Admit Card on the last working day of the preceding week of the date of examination.

- No Admit Card will be sent by post.

The candidates will not be allowed to withdraw their applications after the submission of the same. Candidate should have details of one Photo ID Card viz. Aadhaar Card//PAN Card/Passport/School ID Card/Any other Photo ID Card issued by the State/Central Government. This Photo ID Card will be used for all future reference, and the candidate is advised to carry this Photo ID Card while appearing for Examination/Personality Test.

4. MOBILE PHONES BANNED:

- The use of any mobile phone (even in switched off mode), pager or any electronic equipment or programmable device or storage media like pen drive, smart watches etc. or camera or blue tooth devices or any other equipment or related accessories either in working or switched off mode capable of being used as a communication device during the examination is strictly prohibited. Any infringement of these instructions shall entail disciplinary action including banning future examinations.
- Candidates are advised in their own interest not to bring any of the banned items including mobile phones/pagers to the venue of the examination, as no arrangement for safe keeping will be made at the venue of the examination.

5. Plan of Examination: The Blue Birds Civil Services Examination will consist of two successive stages:

I. Preliminary Examination (Objective type) for the selection of candidates for the Main Examination

Preliminary Exam (Objective Type): Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs)

Duration: 02-hour

Total Marks: 300

No. of Questions 120

2.5 Marks for each correct answer.

PENALTY FOR WRONG ANSWERS: Candidates should note that there will be penalty (negative marking) for wrong answers marked by a candidate in the Objective Type Question Papers. **Negative of 0.5 Marks for each Incorrect Choice.**

II. Mains Exam (Descriptive Type): Short answer and essay-type questions (only for students who qualify in Prelims)

Duration: 2 hours

Total Marks: 300

No of Questions: 15 (With internal Choices)

20 Marks each

There will be no negative marking in Mains Examination and Interview.

III. Interview: Personal interview to assess personality, communication skills, and general awareness

Duration: 15-20 minutes

Total Marks: 100 (only for students who qualify in Mains)

6. Eligibility Conditions:

- A citizen of India and a student of Class 8,9 and 11 studying in Blue Birds International School.
- A candidate in whose case a certificate of eligibility is necessary, may be admitted to the examination **Blue Birds** strives to have a workforce which reflects gender balance and women candidates are encouraged to apply.
- A candidate who is found by the Commission to be guilty of submitting fabricated/incorrect documents or documents which have been tampered with; or uploading irrelevant or incorrect photo/signature in the application form in place of actual photo/signature; or being in possession of or using unfair means during the examination; or writing obscene matter or drawing obscene sketches or irrelevant matter in the scripts; or misbehaving in the examination hall including tearing of the scripts, provoking fellow examinees to boycott examination, creating a disorderly scene

and the like; or harassing, threatening or doing bodily harm to the staff employed by the Commission for the conduct of the examination; or being in possession of or using any mobile phone, (even in switched-off mode), pager or any electronic equipment or programmable device or storage media like pen drive, smart watches etc. or camera or Bluetooth devices or any other equipment or related accessories (either in working or switched-off mode) capable of being used as a communication device during the examination; or violating any of the instructions issued to candidates along with their admission certificates permitting them to take the examination; or attempting to commit or, as the case may be, abetting the commission of all or any of the acts specified in the foregoing clauses, will be barred from the examination process.

7. General Instructions (Preliminary as well as Main Examination):

- Candidates must write the papers in their own hand. In no circumstances will they be allowed the help of a scribe to write the answers for them.
- However, The Persons with Benchmark Disabilities in the categories of blindness, loco motor disability, such candidates will be eligible for the facility of scribe on production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation to write, and scribe is essential to write examination on behalf, from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care institution.

8. SYLLABI FOR THE EXAMINATION: Candidates are advised to go through the Syllabus published in this Section for the Preliminary Examination and the Main Examination.

Part A- Preliminary Examination

INDIAN HISTORY (05 QUESTIONS)

Indus Valley Civilization, Buddhism, Jainism, Sikhism, Mauryan Dynasty, Gupta Dynasty, Harshavardhana, Rajput Era, Sultanate Era, Mughal Empire, Maratha, The Colonial Era.

INDIAN NATIONAL MOVEMENT (05 QUESTIONS)

Revolution of 1857, Early years of Independence Movement, Swadeshi and Civil Disobedience Movement, Role of Mahatma Gandhi and other political leaders, Revolutionary Movement, Role of Revolutionaries, Quit India Movement.

GEOGRAPHY (05 QUESTIONS)

Locating Places on the Earth, Oceans and Continents, Rivers, Mountains, Deserts, Forests, Mineral Resources, Understanding of weather and Climate, Time Zones, Natural Resources and Their Use.

INDIAN ECONOMY (05 QUESTIONS)

The value of Work, Economic Activities around us, Barter System, Introduction of Money, Understanding Markets, Factors of Production, Banking, GST.

INDIAN CONSTITUTION AND PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION (10 QUESTIONS)

The Constitution of India (Constitutional Development, Foreign sources, Preamble, Directive Principles, Fundamental Rights and Duties) Parliamentary System, Federal System, Judicial Framework, District Administration, Panchayati Raj, Electoral System of India

GENERAL STUDIES II (30 QUESTIONS OF 2.5 MARKS EACH)

GENERAL SCIENCE (10 QUESTIONS)

Electricity (Magnetic and Heating Effect), Heat and Measurement of Temperature, Motion (Distance Displacement and its measurement), Light Mirrors and Lenses, Force and Pressure. Matter (States of Matter and its conversion), Elements (Metals and Non-metals), Compounds and Mixtures, Acid, Bases and Salts, Separation of Mixtures, Physical and Chemical Changes.

Diversity in Living World, Food and Nutrition, Life Processes in Plants and Animals, Microorganism (Friend and Foe), Age of Adolescence.

CURRENT EVENTS (01 OCTOBER 2025 ONWARDS) (10 QUESTIONS)

New Appointments, Chief Ministers and Governors, Noble Prizes, Awards (Oscars, National Filmfare Awards, Cultural Awards, National Awards), National and International Events of Indian Importance.

STATIC GK (05 QUESTIONS)

Languages, Art and Culture, Folk Dance Forms, important Days and Dates, Temples, Capitals and Currencies, Indian States and Union Territories, Sports.

COMPUTER AND TECHNOLOGY (05 QUESTIONS)

Basic Knowledge of Computer, MS Word, Shortcut Keys, Some Important AI Tools, Recent Developments in AI and Tech.

NUMERICAL AND MENTAL ABILITIES (30 QUESTIONS OF 2.5 MARKS EACH)

ELEMENTARY ARITHMETIC (20 QUESTIONS)

Number System, Fractions, Decimals, Percentage, Average, Square and Square Roots, Cube and Cube Roots, Exponents, Simplification (BODMAS), Algebra (Expressions and Identities), Direct and Inverse Proportion, Data Interpretation, Simple and Compound Interest, Time and Work.

REASONING AND LOGICAL ABILITY (10 QUESTIONS)

Sequence and Series, Blood Relations, Calendar and Clock, Cause and Effect, Coding-Decoding.

UNDERSTANDING OF LANGUAGE (30 QUESTIONS OF 2.5 MARKS EACH)

LANGUAGE I (GENERAL ENGLISH) (15 QUESTIONS)

English Grammar, Unseen Passages, Antonyms, Synonyms, Gender, Homophones, Idioms and Proverbs, Common Errors.

LANGUAGE II (GENERAL HINDI) (15 QUESTIONS)

वर्णमाला, संधि, विलोम शब्द, पर्यायवाची शब्द, लिंग, समान उच्चारण वाले शब्द, मुहावरे और कहावतें, सामान्य गलतियाँ, लेखक और उनकी रचनाएँ, अपठित गद्यांश, अनेक शब्दों के लिए एक शब्द, संज्ञा, सर्वनाम, विशेषण।

Part B—Main Examination

- The main Examination is intended to assess the overall intellectual traits and depth of understanding of candidates rather than merely the range of their information and memory.
- The nature and standard of questions in the General Studies paper will be such that a well-educated person will be able to answer them **without any specialized study**.
- The questions will be such as to test a candidate's general awareness of a variety of subjects.
- The questions are likely to test the candidate's basic understanding of all relevant issues, and ability to analyze, and take a view on conflicting socio-economic goals, objectives and demands.
- The candidates must give relevant, meaningful and succinct answers.

The pattern of questions would be broad as follows:

- (i) Comprehension of given passages.
- (ii) Precis Writing.
- (iii) Usage and Vocabulary.
- (iv) Short Essays.

- (v) Translation from English to Hindi and vice-versa.
(vi) Detailed Answer type questions based on syllabus given above in GS-I and GS- II.

Interview/Personality Test

- The candidate will be interviewed by a Board who will have before them a record of the candidate's performance in Prelims and Mains Exam.
- The candidate will be asked questions on matters of general interest. The Interview/Personality Test is intended to judge the mental caliber of a candidate.
- In broad terms this is really an assessment of not only intellectual qualities but also social traits and interest in current affairs.
- Some of the qualities to be judged are mental alertness, critical powers of assimilation, clear and logical exposition, balance of judgment, variety and depth of interest, ability for social cohesion and leadership, intellectual and moral integrity.
- The technique of the Interview/Personality Test is not that of a strict cross-examination but of a natural, though directed and purposive conversation which is intended to reveal the mental qualities of the candidate.
- The Interview/Personality Test is not intended to be a test either of the specialized or general knowledge of the candidates which has been already tested through their written papers.
- Candidates are expected to have taken an intelligent interest not only in their special subjects of academic study but also in the events which are happening around them both within and outside their own State or Country as well as in modern currents of thought and in new discoveries which should rouse the curiosity of well-educated youth.

Prizes and certificates
